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SCHOOLS FAILING JOB TEST

For decades, parents have
 clamored for better schools.
 Now, as the economy
 falters, the demand for
 quality education has
 become a political hot issue.



Parents are demanding
 more from their schools
 than ever before. They
 want better teachers,
 smaller class sizes,
 and more resources.
 In many areas, these
 demands are being met,
 but in others, they are
 not. This is especially
 true in urban and inner-
 city areas, where schools
 often lack the resources
 needed to provide a
 quality education.

They're going to school but not learning - Making 100 schools

More than 100 schools
 across the country are
 failing to meet the
 standards set by the
 Department of Education.
 These schools are often
 in urban and inner-city
 areas, where resources
 are limited and the
 needs of the students
 are often unmet.

One of the main reasons
 for this is a lack of
 funding. Schools in
 these areas often receive
 less money per student
 than schools in wealthier
 areas. This means they
 have fewer resources
 for teachers, materials,
 and facilities. Another
 reason is a high teacher
 turnover rate. Many
 teachers in these schools
 do not stay for more
 than a few years, which
 makes it difficult to
 build a strong faculty.

There are many ways
 to improve these schools.
 One is to increase
 funding. Another is to
 attract and retain
 high-quality teachers.
 This can be done by
 offering higher salaries
 and better benefits.
 Another way is to
 provide more training
 and support for
